

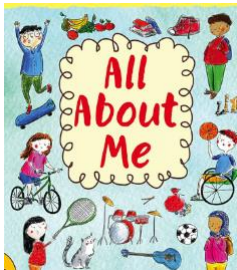
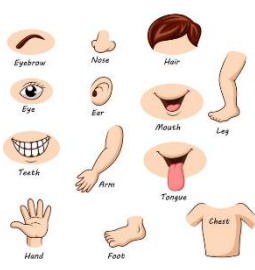
Curriculum Overview: French
