Most Hindus (Sanatanis) believe in only one Supreme Being – Brahman – and that all other deities are an incarnation/representation of Brahman to help them to focus on worship Most Hindus believe that every living thing has a spark of Brahman (atman) in it and therefore that Brahman exists in every living creature. Festivals and pilgrimage are ways in which some Hindus show their devotion to Brahman	Most Christians believe: God is a Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit God is Three – and yet One – and each is equal Each Person of the Trinity has a distinct character and purpose, but is still part of the one God	Most Christians believe that: • ancient prophecies in the Old Testament foretell the birth, life and death of Jesus • Jesus fulfilled many Old Testament prophecies, and because of this, Jesus is the 'Messiah' • Jesus himself prophesied his death and resurrection • a prophecy is a message from God	 The story of how Prince Siddhartha Gautama became Buddha 'Buddha' means 'awakened' or 'enlightened one' Most Buddhists follow the teachings of the Buddha to gain enlightenment (Nirvana) which is achieved by meditating There are Four Noble Truths in Buddhism Most Buddhists follow the Eightfold Path, which is the Middle Way (the 4th of the Noble Truths) 	Most Christians believe that: they have a new, eternal life in Jesus, who calls them to live distinctively they have a part to play in the work of God who calls them to act justly, love mercy and walk humbly in the world the Holy Spirit enables them in this way of living	Someone's identity is part of who they are, and is unique to them: Someone's identity may come from their personality, beliefs, education, background and/or experiences Being a part of your school community has helped to prepare them for the move to secondary school
